



# FWHP Action Item II.A Assess Statewide Ecological Condition

### Need - a comprehensive picture showing:

- where restoration is most needed
- where projects are implemented and where there are gaps
- where the myriad of federal, state, tribal, local and private projects are linked to each other or at cross-purposes

FWHP Action Item II.A
Assess Statewide Ecological Condition

#### Recommendation:

- Assess statewide ecological conditions and restoration needs
- Analyze environmental threats to communities, causes of degradation, current restoration activities, and distribution of funds
- Identify gaps and opportunities



States must develop and submit a Statewide Assessment and Strategies for Forest Resources to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior by 2010 For the Farm Bill, the focus is on state and private lands

For New Mexico's assessment, the focus is on all jurisdictions

Although the Farm Bill requires only the forest assessment, we are looking at all ecosystems across the whole state. Therefore, some special emphasis will be given to forests based on Farm Bill requirements.
